●Until 6th of May, in all prefectures, the residents are encouraged to avoid unnecessary travels, asked to limit the number of visitors within a facilities and to reduce contacts with others at least by 70% - 80%

For the time being, foreign nationals categorized below are denied permission to enter Japan as ones who fall under the Article 5, paragraph (1), item (xiv) of Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act, unless exceptional circumstances are found.

The following 14 countries have newly been added to (1) below based on the decision made on April 27. Foreigners who have stayed in these countries within 14 days prior to the application for landing will be denied landing into Japan. The measure is effective from 00:00am (JST) on April 29.

United Arab Emirates, Antigua and Barbuda, Ukraine, Oman, Qatar, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Djibouti, Saint Christopher and Nevis, Dominican Republic, Barbados, Belarus, Peru, Russia

Total Scale

117 trillion yen (approximately 6.8 trillion DKK) (20% of Japan's GDP)

Measures in support of business

- Expanding special measures on the Employment Adjustment Subsidies
- Real interest-free unsecured loans
- Improved loan conditions: allowing recurring debts to be refinanced as interest free loans
- Deferment of the payments of national taxes and social security premiums without collateral and penalties (amounting to ¥26 trillion (approx. 1.6trillion DKK))

Cash Payments

- Cash payment of ¥100,000 (approx. 6,250DKK) each to individuals in need
- Cash payments of ¥2 million(125,000 DKK) each to micro-, small-, and medium-sized business and ¥1 million(62,500 DKK) each to individual business owners

Measures in support of Culture, Art and Sports

- -If an audience of the canceled event does not claim a refund of the ticket price, part of the amount of the ticket price will be deducted from the income tax.
- -A scheme where <u>fans themselves support sports</u>, <u>culture and the arts</u>.

4. Contribution to International Community

Telephone Talk between Prime Minister ABE Shinzo and WHO Director-General Dr. Tedros Adhanom March 30, 2020

- Prime Minister Abe stated that development of medicines and vaccines would be crucial in order to contain and roll back the global spread of the infection, and that, going forward, Japan intends to promote clinical research on Favipiravir in collaboration with other willing countries. He also asked for support from the WHO to accelerate development of medicines and vaccines by obtaining the overall information on various efforts taking place in the world, avoiding duplications, and identifying areas that we should focus on.
- Prime Minister Abe explained that Japan has led the global effort for international assistance and supported countries with weak health systems through the WHO/SPRP Strategic Preparedness and Response Plan with \$46 million and expressly asked Dr. Tedros to make this fund available for effective technical assistance to health workers and others in developing countries where the number of cases is rapidly increasing.

Emergency grant aid to deliver the anti-viral medicine "Avigan", April 8, 2020

- On 7th April, the Government of Japan decided to provide Emergency Grant Aid of 1 million
 US dollars to the countries with COVID-19 patients.
- This will provide "Avigan" tablets as requested by beneficiary governments through UNOPS.

Press Release

- In a call on Tuesday 24 March 2020, based on information provided by the WHO at the time, IOC President Thomas Bach and Japanese Prime Minister ABE Shinzō concluded that the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 would be held in their complete form and not later than summer 2021. The Prime Minister reiterated that the government of Japan stands ready to fulfil its responsibility for hosting these successful Games. At the same time, IOC President Thomas Bach stressed the full commitment of the IOC to successful Olympic Games Tokyo 2020.
- Added benefit that any disruption that the postponement will cause to the international sports calendar can be kept to a minimum, in the interests of the athletes and the IFs.
- Provide sufficient time to finish the qualification process. The same heat mitigation measures as planned for 2020 will be implemented.
